Richard Willett is the author of the plays "Triptych," "Random Harvest," "The Flid Show," and "Tiny Bubbles," which have been presented off-off-Broadway and at theaters across the country. Honors include an Edward F. Albee Foundation Fellowship and a Tennessee Williams Scholarship. His play "A Terminal Event" (Julie Harries Playwriting Award from the Beverly Hills Theatre Guild and finalist for the Woodward/Newman Drama Award) received its world premiere at the Victory Theatre in LA, in June 2022; "9/10" is scheduled for a world premiere in NY in 2023; and he is developing a one-woman show about Ingrid Bergman with actress Annemette Anderson and director Henning Hegland in New York, London, and Copenhagen.

GRIEF AT HIGH TIDE

This year's top honor goes to Richard Willett and his play "Grief at High Tide," which rose to the top of 400+ submissions from playwrights across the country. This contemporary drama examines the impact a published photo has on the lives of the subject(s) within the photo and the photographer who took it. When Jennifer Evers is awarded a prize for a photo she took of her husband in a very private moment of his life (but did she have the right to submit it to a contest?), her marriage hits a decidedly rough spot. In an attempt to gain perspective, Jennifer seeks out a Pulitzer prize winning veteran journalist to discuss his prize-winning photo - Grief at High Tide, and the effects it has had on his life - and the lives of those in the photo. Jennifer is given a window into what the potential effects ones right to capture someone else's 'private' moment can have.

Rachel Lynett (she/they) is a queer Afro-Latine playwright, producer, and teaching artist. Their plays have been produced all over the country including Orlando Shakes Theatre, Barrington Stage Company, and Florida Studio Theatre. Rachel Lynett is also the 2021 recipient of the Yale Drama Prize for their play, "Apologies to Lorraine Hansberry (You Too August Wilson)." Lynett was 2021 recipient of the National Latinx Playwriting award and the runner-up for the 2022 Miranda Family Voces Latinx Playwriting Competition for their play, "Black Mexican." Their play, "White People by the Lake" was also a 2022 Blue Ink Award finalist They have previously taught at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, the University of Wisconsin, Madison, and Alfred University. Lynett was recently a staff writer for a Netflix series, a staff writer for The Winchesters, and is working on an upcoming feature with 30K FT Productions.

"HENRY JOHNSON: BALLAD OF A FORGOTTEN HERO

(working title)": Come hear a draft of the newest play to join the REP's On-The -Go! touring program. Henry Johnson has a street named for him in Albany, but why? The World War I soldier proved his bravery on the battlefield with the all-Black New York National Guard 369th Infantry Regiment. He led a victory parade through the streets of his birthplace but was scarred in body and spirit by the toils of war. For decades, he was denied his due from the United States military. Playwright Rachel Lynett, with historical and dramaturgical research by Skidmore professor Eunice Ferreira, brings Henry Johnson to life with text and music from the Jazz and Ragtime era. Discover how the fight to recognize a real hero was finally won in 2015 when Henry Johnson received the Medal of Honor from President Barack Obama.

What is the FIRST 15? This event is curated to mirror the reading process the REP's NEXT ACT! Reading Committee Members encounter, specifically those involved in the first round of the reading process. It also simulates what most Literary Managers encounter:

"Read a synopsis and the first 10-pages of the script, and 'decide' whether or not you want to request the full script from the playwright."

Did the plot grab you? Are the characters interesting and well developed? Does the dialogue ring true to you? Do you want to know what happens next...?

The pieces selected for the FIRST 15 are scripts that rose to the top but ultimately were not selected for a full reading this year. The event also provides the REP with the opportunity to get to know and work with more playwrights. Several pieces that have been in past FIRST 15 Readings have gone on to full summit readings, the summit's Stage 2Screen Event, and several have even gone on to full productions on the REP's stage.
