

What is the FIRST 15? This event is curated to mirror the reading process the REP's NEXT ACT! Reading Committee Members encounter, specifically those involved in the first round of the reading process. It also simulates what most Literary Managers encounter:

"Read a synopsis and the first 10-pages of the script, and 'decide' whether or not you want to request the full script from the playwright."

Did the plot grab you? Are the characters interesting and well developed? Does the dialogue ring true to you? Do you want to know what happens next...?

The pieces selected for the FIRST 15 are scripts that rose to the top but ultimately were not selected for a full reading this year. The event also provides the REP with the opportunity to get to know and work with more playwrights. Several pieces that have been in past FIRST 15 Readings have gone on to full summit readings, the summit's Stage 2 Screen Event, and several have even gone on to full productions on the REP's stage.







When Tingley retired in July 2020, his column had been named a finalist by the National Society of Newspaper Columnists in 8 of the past 10 years. It was honored with a firstplace award in 2016. His second book - "The Last American Newspaper" - is a memoir about the importance of newspapers in their community and all the great work The Post-Star contributed to the Glens Falls community. 
